

Important Safety Instructions

- 1. Read these instructions.
- 2. Keep these instructions.

- 5. Do not use this apparatus near water.
- 6. Clean only with dry cloth.
- 7. Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- 8. Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- 9. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
- 10. Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.
- 11. Only use attachments / accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- 12. Use only with the cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart / apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over.
- 13. Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
- 14. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. 1. Cleaning

Always unplug the TV before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a soft, slightly damp cloth to clean.

2. Water and Moisture

Do not use this TV near water. Avoid using this TV in an excessively damp environment.

3. Stand

This TV should always be placed on a solid, sturdy surface.

4. Ventilation

To prevent overheating, do not block or obstruct the vent openings on the TV's back panel. Also, avoid placing this TV in a confined area with poor air flow.

5. Power Sources

This TV should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of The type of power supply to your home, consult your electronics retailer or local power company.

6. Power Cord Polarization

This TV is equipped with a three-wire grounding type plug, a plug with a third (grounding) pin. As a safety feature, this plug will only fit into a grounded power outlet. If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact your electrician to replace the obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounding-type plug.

7. Power Cord Protection

Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them. Pay particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the TV.

8. Lightning


To protect the TV during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the TV from lightning and power-line surges.

9. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the TV be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code (U.S. A.), ANSI / NFPA 70 provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

10. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall on to power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

11. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

12. Object and Liquid Entry

Never push objects of any kind into this TV through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on or inside the TV.

13. Servicing

Do not attempt to service this TV yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to a qualified service technician.

14. Damage Requiring Service

Unplug from the wall outlet and refer servicing to a qualified service technician under the following conditions:

- a. If the power-supply cord or plug is damaged.
- b. If liquid has been spilled, or objects have fallen into the product.
- c. If the TV has been exposed to rain or water.
- d. If the TV does not operate normally by following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions as an improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the product to its normal operation.
- e. If the TV has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged.
- f. If the TV exhibits a distinct change in performance.

15. Replacement Parts

When replacement parts are required, be sure that only an authorized service technician has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer or have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards and void any warranty.

16. Safety Check

Upon completion of any service or repairs to this TV, ask the service technician to perform safety checks to determine whether the product is in proper operating condition.

17. Wall Mounting

The TV should be mounted to a wall only by a professional. The TV may slide or fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the product. Warranty shall be voided. Wall hanging height of the whole machine shall not exceed 2m.

18. Heat

The TV should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other products (including amplifiers) that produce heat.

19. Remote Control

Do not expose the remote control to liquids, direct sunlight or sources of excessive heat.

NOTE TO CABLE / TV INSTALLER:


Introduction

Remote Control Battery Install

Your remote control handset is powered by two (2) AAA type batteries



• Turn the remote over and remove battery cover.




• Place two (2) "AAA" batteries into the battery compartment with the "+" and "-" ends facing as indicated.



Replace the cover

- Effective remote range is approximately 16 feet at an angle of no greater than 30° to the left / right or 20° up / down to the IR sensor.
- To avoid possible damage from battery chemical leakage, remove the batteries if you do not plan to use the remote for an extended period of time. Do not mix batteries of different age and / or type. Always discard used batteries safely.
- Do not expose the remote control to liquids, direct sunlight or sources of excessive heat.
- The IR receiver on the TV will not work properly if the set is in direct sunlight.

NOTE: Improper use of batteries can result in a chemical leakage or explosion.



- 1. Headphone Jack Connect a stereo headphone (not included) for private listening.
- **2. SPDIF** Connect an optional coaxial digital cable (not included) through a compatible amp / receiver to enjoy superior audio sound.
- **3. AV Input** Connect an external device to the composite VIDEO(Y) and AUDIO (L / R) out jacks found on most video equipment.
- **4. Component Y Pb Pr Input** Connect to an AV device that features component (Y Pb Pr) video and audio output jacks.
- **5. HDMI Input** Connects to digital AV equipment that feature HDMI connectivity. HDMI supports enhanced high definition video and up to 7.1-channel digital audio all from one cable. Recommended for best performance. HDMI cable not included.
- **6. PC IN VGA Input** Connect an optional VGA cable (not included) from your personal computer.
 - **PC Audio Input** Audio cable (not included) for sound.
- **7. RF Input** Connect an antenna or cable connection for television reception. Note: Use an outdoor antenna, cable or satellite for best reception.
- **8. USB Input Port** Connect to portable USB device such as USB flash / hard drive, supports MP3 and JPEG.


Connection to Antenna & Cable / Satellite Box

It is strongly recommended that the installation of a high quality roof top antenna, digital cable, or satellite set top box be used in conjunction with your television for best broadcast reception. For indoor use, we recommend an Apex Digital amplified HDTV antenna. Note: reception is determined by your regional location, geographical terrain, distance from the local broadcast transmitter and strength of antenna.









- Connect the white / red audio cables for sound from the audio (L / R) output jacks on your external equipment (i.e.: DVD Player, set top box) to the AV (L / R) jacks on the TV's panel.






Connecting to a Stereo Receiver / Amplifier

Initial Setup Wizard

Setup Wizard only appears when first turning the TV on and without channel scanning.

After connecting your TV antenna or cable wire, turn the television ON. The quick setup wizard will display on-screen. Select your preferred Picture setting followed by antenna options and performing Auto Scan to receive local broadcast channels that will be stored in the TV tuner memory.

The wizard will direct you to the TV menu to select antenna options and perform Channel Auto Scan. Channels found will be stored into the TV tuner memory.



How to Navigate:

- Press the arrow button to highlight AIR / CABLE based on your antenna connection.
- Highlight Start to Scan and press ENTER.
- Channel Auto Scan may take several minutes to complete.

After the Setup Wizard has been completed, please skip this page as your Cable/Antenna is already set up. The following instructions on this page are provided if you need to make changes at a later time.

NOTE: For Cable or Satellite users <u>WITH</u> a set-top box, there is no need to run Channel Auto Scan. Connect your cable or satellite set top box to one of the available inputs on the TV for viewing.

To enter the Channel Menu:

- · Press the MENU button
- Using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons; scroll to highlight Channel
- Press the down ▼ arrow buttons to highlight Air / Cable

Select Cable if you subscribe to a pay television service WITHOUT a set top box.

- Press the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to highlight Cable

Picture Setting

The **Picture** menu offers options to enhance and refine the picture displayed on your TV based on ambient room light and personal preferences. Adjustment options include contrast, brightness, color, sharpness and color temperature.

How to Navigate:

Press the **MENU** button on the remote control. Navigate using ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to select **Picture**. Press the down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Picture Mode**, then press the ▶ arrow button to select your viewing preference from 5 factory options: EnergySaving > User > Standard > Dynamic > Mild. The Standard setting is recommended for most brightly lit viewing environments. Depending on the ambient light level in the room, you may find one of the other Picture settings more pleasing.

To make more critical adjustments based on your own preferences in User.

Contrast

Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Contrast**. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to increase or decrease contrast intensity.

Brightness

Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Brightness**. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to increase or decrease overall brightness.

Color

Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Color**. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to increase or decrease color intensity.

Tint

Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Tint**. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to adjust colors toward green or reddish tint.

Sharpness

Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Sharpness**. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to soften or view crisper edges in the picture.

Color Temperature.

Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight your

Color Temperature. preference. Navigate using the ▼ arrow buttons to select Cool, Medium or Warm setting.


