


- 1) Read these instructions.

POWER

AC POWER (Wall Outlet)

- Plug the supplied AC Power Cord into the Power Cord Input (20) on the rear of the unit.
- 2. Insert the wall plug of the AC Power Cord into an electrical wall outlet.

BATTERY POWER

- 1. Open the **Battery Compartment (21)** by gently sliding the compartment door in the direction indicated on the bottom of the unit.
- 2. Insert 8 'C' size batteries (not included) into the **Battery Compartment (21)**. Be sure to place the batteries in the same polarity (+ or -) direction indicated on the engraved diagram inside the **Battery Compartment (21)**.
- 3. Replace the door to the **Battery Compartment (21)** by carefully sliding it back into place.

VOLUME

The volume is adjusted by turning the **VOLUME Knob (3)** on the left side of the unit.

- To Increase the Volume: Rotate the VOLUME Knob (3) toward the Rear of the unit.
- To Decrease the Volume: Rotate the VOLUME Knob (3) toward the Front of the unit.

PLAYING A CD

- 1. Open the CD Door (18) by gently lifting the door with your thumb and index finger.
- 2. Insert a CD with the label side facing UP.
- 3. Close the CD Door (18) by gently pressing down on the door with your finger.
- 4. Adjust the **FUNCTION SWITCH (2)** to the **CD** position. The player will automatically turn ON and the total number of tracks (songs) on the CD will be shown on the **CD Track Display (8)**.
- 5. Press the PLAY/PAUSE button (10) to start playing the CD. The PLAY/PAUSE Indicator Light (7) will automatically turn on.
- 6. Press the PLAY/PAUSE button (10) again to momentarily pause playback. The PLAY/PAUSE Indicator Light (7) will automatically start blinking. To resume playback press the PLAY/PAUSE button (10) again.
- 7. To Stop playing the CD press the **STOP** button (5).

SKIPPING TRACKS (SONGS)

- To skip to the next track press the NEXT/F.FWD button (14)
- To move to the beginning of the current track press the PREVIOUS/F.REV button (12)
- To skip to a previous track press the **PREVIOUS/F.REV** button (12) multiple times in a row until the desired track is shown on the **CD Track Display (8)**.

SEARCHING TRACKS

- While playing a CD press and hold the NEXT/F.FWD button (14) to scan Fast
 Forward through the current track. Release the button when you reach the desired
 portion of the track you want to hear.
- Press and hold the PREVIOUS/F.REV button (12) to Fast Reverse through the current track. Release the button when you reach the desired portion of the track you want to hear.

PROGRAMMED PLAYBACK

Up to 20 tracks of a CD can be programmed to play in any desired order.

- 1. To set a Program order, first make sure the CD is not currently playing by pressing the **STOP** button **(5)**
- 2. Press the **PROGRAM** button **(4)**. The **PROGRAM Indicator Light (6)** will automatically start blinking, and the **CD Track Display (8)** will start blinking "01"
- 3. Press the NEXT/F.FWD (14) or PREVIOUS/F.REV (12) button to until the number of the first track you want to program is shown in the CD Track Display (8).
- 4. Press the **PROGRAM** button **(4)** to program the track. The **CD Track Display (8)** will automatically start blinking "02".
- 5. Repeat steps 3 & 4 to program up to 20 different tracks.
- 6. When you have finished selecting tracks, press the PLAY/PAUSE button (10) to start playing the CD in the order you have programmed. The PROGRAM Indicator Light (6) and PLAY/PAUSE Indicator Light (7) will both turn ON.
- 7. To stop Programmed Playback press the **STOP** button **(5)** twice. The **PROGRAM Indicator Light (6)** will automatically turn OFF.

REPEAT PLAYBACK

- To Repeat a Single Track press the REPEAT button (11) once. The REPEAT Indicator Light (9) will automatically start blinking.
- To Repeat the Entire CD press the REPEAT button (11) twice. The REPEAT Indicator Light (9) will automatically turn ON.
- To cancel Repeat Playback press the REPEAT button (11) continuously until the REPEAT Indicator Light (9) turns OFF.

PLAYING an iPod®, MP3 PLAYER, or OTHER DEVICE

- 1. Plug one end of a 3.5mm stereo audio cable (not included) into the **AUX-IN JACK (1)** on the left side of the player.
 - NOTE: The player will automatically stop CD or RADIO playback and switch to the AUX-IN connection.
- 2. Plug the other end of the cable into the headphone jack or audio output of your external device.
- 3. Adjust the volume on your external device to an acceptable level.
- 4. Press PLAY on your external device to being listening.
 - NOTE: All playback controls (Play/Pause, Stop, Next/Previous, must be controlled on your external device)
- 5. To resume CD or RADIO playback, simply unplug the 3.5mm stereo audio cable from the **AUX-IN JACK (1)**.

LISTEN TO AM/FM RADIO

- 1. Adjust the **FUNCTION SWITCH (2)** to the **RADIO** position.
- 2. Adjust the **BAND SELECTOR SWITCH (16)** to your desired setting (AM, FM, or FM STEREO).
- 3. Slowly adjust the **TUNING KNOB** (15) to select the desired Radio station.

TIPS FOR BEST RECEPTION

- The AM & FM antennas are built-in to the cabinet of this player. To improve reception of radio stations simply move the entire player to another location until reception improves.
 - NOTE: If FM STEREO is selected, the FM STEREO Indicator Light (19) will automatically turn ON when a station has a strong reception.

USING THE DIGITAL BASS BOOST (DBBS) FEATURE

- To enhance the low-frequency bass sounds from the player, simply turn the DBBS feature ON by pressing the DBBS button (13) to the "IN" position as shown below.
- To turn the DBBS feature OFF, simply press the **DBBS** button **(13)** again to return the button to the "OUT" position as shown below.

TROUBLESHOOTING
